Chair's Report: Cindy C. reported that she attended the IGLC meeting via Zoom. The General Service Conf theme was "Connect with Love, Unity, and Service." Terry, Area 29 delegate reported on the 74th General Service Conference. There has been discussion of changing the founder's writings of the Big Book and the 12 and 12. At this time, they are not making changes and it is still in discussion. Maryland delegates have given feedback on the possible changes, and no one wants them at this time. The AA World Services is working on creating American Sign Language videos to be air on their YouTube channel. There is a plain language Big Book in the works.
