Chair's Report: Cindy C. reported that the IGLC discussed the need for more meetings for deaf members, It is expensive to have a certified interpreter, and they need to be able to communicate the message of AA. To assist with this cost, HAIG is asking intergroups to consider passing a Yellow Can at meetings to collect donations to assist with paying for certified interpreters at these meetings. There are potentially 60,000 deaf AA members in Maryland.

 Registration for the 2025 AA International Convention in Vancouver opens September 10, 2024, at 12:00 PM. The convention takes place July 3-6, 2025. Advance registration fees (prior to April 15, 2025) are \$160.00. The paper registration was sent out last week by the Outreach committee.
